

## 1.2 Record of Protected Structures – Environs

### *Introduction*

Appendix 1.2 is to be read in conjunction with the relevant policies of the Written Statement. The locations of Protected Structures are shown on Map 1.5. It is the policy of the Council to secure the protection of buildings, features, sites and structures of special architectural, historical, archaeological, artistic, cultural, scientific, social or technical interest listed here.

### *Explanation of Format*

- Map Ref.** Refers to the identification numbers on Map 1.5.
- Townland** Denotes the townland location of the building, feature or item to be protected.
- Structure** Identifies the feature to be protected.
- Description** Gives a brief description of the item to be protected.

Map Ref.	Townland	Structure	Description
1	Ardgeeha Upper	Lime Kiln	Located at the eastern part of a disused limestone quarry set in the centre of a field of 8 hectares to the immediate north of Clonmel Borough boundary.
2	Ballinamore	Anner Castle	Built in 1860s by Rev. N.N. Mandeville. Impressive castle of random ashlar, incorporating the old square castle of the Mandeville family. Impressive entrance front with twin octagonal battlement and machicolated towers. Burnt in 1926, only the front of which has been rebuilt.
3	Ballingarrane	Ballingarrane House	A late 18 <sup>th</sup> century house, two storeys over a basement in front & three storeys behind. Front of five bays and quoins, doorcase with baseless pediment and Doric column; steps with elegant wrought iron railing; Small two storey, one bay wings set back.
4	Ballyglasheen	Ballyglasheen Castle	In ruins.
5	Barn Demesne	Barne Park	A large three-storey house of early 18 <sup>th</sup> Century appearance with eleven bays, the two end bays on either side projecting forward. The central feature consists of paired engaged Doric columns and entablature. 19 <sup>th</sup> Century high pitched roof in French chateau style with dormers added.
6	Rathduff Lower	Thatched House	Single-storey, three-bay farmhouse.
7	Kilheffernan	Kilheffernan House	A simple, three-bay, two-storey house with a cottage ornee addition. The addition has a large gothic window and was probably once thatched, although it is now covered with corrugated sheeting.
8	Killaloe Lower	Church of Ireland Church	In ruins. A small two bay First Fruits Church, with a west tower.
9	Killaloe Lower	Osbourne Mausoleum at Killaloe burial ground	Several overgrown and desecrated Osbourne Mausoleum in the graveyard of the Church of Ireland Church, Killaloe Lower.
10	Killaloe Lower	Old School at Newtownanner	
11	Lawlesstown	Thatched House	Single-storey thatched farmhouse.
12	Newtownanner Demesne	Newtownanner House	A two-storey late Georgian house with a front of nine bays; the three outer bays on either side breaking forwards & rising an extra storey above the centre to form rather wide roof pavilions. The doorway has engaged columns and a large semi-circular fanlight over the door.

13	Newtownanner Demesne	Farmyard to the east of Newtownanner House	Farmyard of stone buildings set out in a court yard.
14	Rathronan	Church of Ireland	Church in ruins. A derelict First Fruits Church with a west tower.
15	Summerhill	Summerhill House	Five bay, two storey possibly early 19 <sup>th</sup> Century house. Door with fanlight & two full-height half hexagon bows either side of doorcase. Ionic colonnade to one side of doorcase (possibly modern).
16	Summerhill	Entrance Lodge & Gates to Summerhill House	Entrance gates with pillars & decorative piers with 'pineapples'.
17	Twomilebridge	Anner Ville	A two-storey Victorian House with a roof carried on a bracket cornice, entrance front with two-storey porch between two single-storey three storey balustraded bows; and in the upper storey two Venetian windows.
